❖ What is *r.a.d.Kids*?

r.a.d.Kids teaches positive, safe choices for children to handle abuse, bullying, and abduction as well as everyday safety issues.

❖ Why take the *r.a.d.Kids* program?

r.a.d.Kids gives children the confidence, skills and self-esteem to recognize, resist and if necessary, escape violence.

❖ Who is eligible to take this program?

The program is designed for children ages 5 to 12 years old. * Parents are highly encouraged to accompany their child during the 10-hour curriculum; however, it is not mandatory.

The program covers a wide range of subjects including, but not limited to:

- ❖ Safety at home, at play and at school
- ❖ Responses to bullying
- ❖ Avoiding and, if necessary, escaping predators
- ❖ Good, bad and uncomfortable touch
- ❖ Internet safety
- ❖ Planning for emergencies such as fire and natural disasters

Children receive prizes, workbook and a certificate of completion; parents' manual included.
